

## **GOD TEACHES US...**

PRAYER OF ILLUMINATION:

SERMON: 'Do or do not; there is no try'

arsenal didn't penetrate the armour of human pride. The Pharaoh would not submit until the plague of death. On that night of the battle royal Lord surely have been a degree of apprehension among even the bravest of the Israelites. It's hard to avoid a sense of the surreal. What their God was asking them to do was totally counter intuitive. The Almighty was instructing them to prepare a family meal when all around them the angel of death was marauding throughout the world of the Egyptians. Yet, it was made clear to Moses that every family was to prepare a roasted lamb and some bitter herbs, all to be accompanied by unleavened bread. Every element on that table was charged with symbolism. The herbs evoked bitter memories of the slavery while the speed with which the unleavened bread was prepared spoke of their quick exit from Egypt. However, above all, it was the blood of that roasted lamb that was the most powerful symbol of all. That blood, sprinkled on the doorposts of every Jewish home was the sign to the angel of death to pass by. Was there fear within those homes? Would roast lamb divert attention from the presence of death heavy in the atmosphere? There's nothing to indicate that these people were any more or less human than we are today. The only deliverance lay in a divinely crafted plan. Though God's ways are so profound that they are always beyond human comprehension there is something basically very simple and totally accessible to anyone willing to take the Almighty liberator at his word. To these people he says, 'trust me, obey me and look to the way of deliverance that I'm providing for you. That lamb was effectively slain so that death would 'pass over' your home and family.' Today, even the media are talking openly of a plague over our land, indeed, over our world. Without taking away anything of the uniqueness of those events recorded in Exodus there is a sense in which we are getting to re-enact that momentous night in Egypt. On a virtually unprecedented scale we are now watching all the 'gods' of our age being challenged – and they, like the earlier Egyptian deities and proving powerless. Need we despair if forced into 'lock down' and 'self isolation'? Or, like the ancient Israelites find that our homes become places of refuge, knowing that ultimately "we make the Most High our dwelling place...where no harm will befall us and no disaster come near our home. (See Psalm 91:9). Christ our Passover lamb has been slain and not even death strikes fear. (I Corinthians 5:7)

WITH the world on edge, fear and uncertainty rising, we definitely need perspective – here is a teaching from another time when God led people through a fearful time... (written by Desi Maxwell)

Surely it was a night to remember? Throughout the land infant mortality peaked and there was the first of what we might call 'fast food' meals. Such was the impact that even the calendar was recalibrated

and to this very day the event is celebrated in the first month of the year. So unique in fact it was recorded in the Bible. We are, of course, referring to the climatic night when the Plague of Death 'passed over' Egypt, and the people of Israel celebrated their God's deliverance by eating a family 'passover' meal within the safety of their own homes. The events of that night are vividly recalled in Exodus 12. The night marked the climax of the showdown between the Pharaoh of Egypt, who fancied himself as a deity and the God of Israel, who is Lord of Lords. Plague after plague dented Egyptian arrogance but didn't break it. Heaven's
